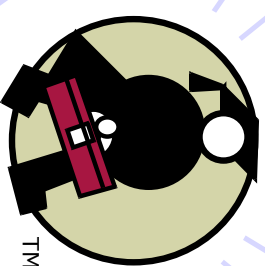

## Designing & Developing Courses using WebCT

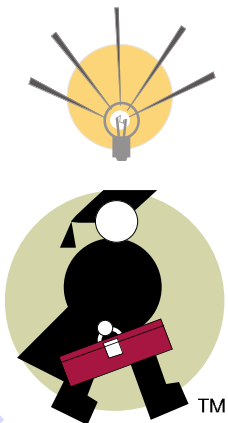
CTLT is very interested in partnering with faculty to explore WebCT with them. Faculty and online learning specialists can work together to:

- identify WebCT's role in achieving course goals

- develop strategies for facilitating online learning
- establish assessment strategies to help improve online learning

## How will I know whether it's working?

CTLT assessment resources can enhance a WebCT course by:

- evaluating the role of WebCT in students' learning
- gaining immediate feedback from students
- sharing implementation strategies among instructors
- illuminating relationships between students' ability to learn difficult concepts and WebCT activities
