### Introductory Materials for Extension/4-H - Launch Date: Sept. 21, 2009

Extension/4-H will begin in their first two months with a special Online Seminar and Self-Instruction Guide to introduce everyone to the basic concepts of volunteerism and to prepare all Extension staff to take full advantage of the program. (These introductory materials will remain accessible to Extension/4-H for the 3-year cycle of the *Everyone Ready* program.) After the first two months, Extension/4-H will join the 36-topic cycle listed below. New topics are introduced on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month.

### **Everyone Ready** Notes:

- **Everyone Ready** is available to all Extension staff regardless of title or program area.
- **Online Seminars** include a Flash audio-visual trainer presentation and downloadable handouts. Both types of modules take about 1 hour per month to complete.
- **Self-Instruction Guides** provide participants with a way to combine written information and exercises that they can do at their desk or with colleagues.
